In 2011, Alpine Market reduced landfill trash, increased local soil production, reduced energy costs and carbon emissions. How did they do it?

Compost!

Diversion rate with composting: 75%



Alpine Market participated in Summit County's pilot compost program, paid for by Frisco Clean Tracks. They composted 50 gallons weekly. Containers were placed in the front of the store for customers and in the back for staff and food preparation. *What did they compost?* Sandwich left overs, baked goods, vegetables, cutlery, napkins and plates. Compost was delivered to the Summit County High Country Compost facility, turned into usable soil, used and sold locally.

Lighting Upgraded!

Energy savings: over 6513 kWh and \$542 annually



Alpine Market replaced over 50 inefficient halogen bulbs with 50 energy efficient LED bulbs. Bulbs deliver high quality and focused lighting to the front of the store. Half of materials and supplies costs were covered by the Frisco Clean Track program.

Lighting and Waste Audits Completed!

Two audits completed: cost effectiveness of upgrades analyzed
